



# **1983 PR Alumna Honored as a** "Woman of Achievement"



After an absence of several years due to Covid-19, the Staten Island Advance's outstanding annual tribute to local women has resumed. This year, the committee that selects the nominees for Women of Achievement recognition, has selected 1983 graduate, Denise Leahy Henick, to be so honored. The two paragraphs that follow will give the reader a good idea as to why Denise, who graced the halls of PRHS as a student, was selected. Denise lived in Mariners Harbor as a child, and attended PS 44 and IS 72. At PRHS in her Senior Year, she was in the Co-Op Program, and got a position in the NYC Mayor's Office. It became full time, and she worked there for 20 years, under Mayor Koch, Dinkins, and Giuliani. There,

she became Deputy Director of Fiscal Operations. She left, to be a full time Mom. In the years ahead, she and her husband Jeff, started their business, "Stop and Stor" and it grew, from one to 19 locations throughout NYC with over 100 employees.

Denise later joined the workforce, and today is a Director of Administration at their Staten Island Stop and Stor Headquarters. She and her husband generously support and raise funds for hundreds of charities, such as Stop and Stor Second Chance (helping former addicts and convicts to rebuild their lives and to advance in their company); Michael's Cause (Muscular Dystrophy); New Eyes for the Needy; Making Strides Against Breast Cancer; Sloan Kettering's Cancer Center; Greenbelt Conservancy etc. She has received many awards such as the Louis L. Miller's Business Leadership Award from the SI Chamber of Commerce, and the Executive Woman of the Year from the SIEDC. As a St. George businesswoman and community leader, Denise has gone above and beyond, to help others. Her record of Philanthropy is extensive, and she works tirelessly for our community and our people. We are very proud of our 1983 Graduate.
