Greetings from Port Richmond High School,



I hope this message finds you well and your loved ones continue to stay healthy and safe. It's hard to believe that my fourth year as principal and twentieth year at Port Richmond is coming to an end. Although this year started out with many challenges including new COVID-19 variants, mask mandates, vaccination mandates and DOE leadership changes, we ended the year on a high note with lots to celebrate.

This June, Port Richmond High School celebrated its highest four-year graduation rate in nearly twenty years. The Port Richmond High School class of 2022,

under the most difficult of learning environments, despite a global pandemic that cheated them out of 16 months of high school, succeeded like no other class in nearly two decades. This was an amazing graduating class that amassed over 9.6 million dollars in academic scholarships to some of the most prestigious colleges and universities in the country. The class of 2022 was accepted to: NYU, Notre Dame, Oxford, Dartmouth, Princeton, Penn State, Rutgers, RIT, MIT, UConn, Columbia, Cal Tech, Stanford, Yale, John's Hopkins, SUNYs, CUNYs and many, many more. In addition, our valedictorian was highlighted on NY1 for his outstanding accomplishments. I'm happy to report that this senior class had an opportunity to participate in all of the senior activities that were missed over the last two years, including a Senior Trip, Senior Night, our Senior Prom, and, most importantly, a "live" in-person graduation ceremony at the historic and beautiful St. George Theatre

Next year is looking to be another outstanding year with our largest incoming freshman class in over 12 years. Next year we will also be starting our third year of our Grades 9-14 P-Tech program in collaboration with the College of Staten Island, Northwell Health and the New York Power Authority. We are also looking forward to continuing our partnership with the Staten Island chapter of the National Council of Negro Women and would like to thank President Nicole Meyers for being our graduation guest speaker this past June. Next year also promises to be exciting with the ribbon cutting and opening of our new 15.7 million dollar athletic complex slated to be finished later on this summer. Our new complex will consist of a new football, soccer, lacrosse field surrounded by a new state of the art track. In addition, a separate field will house a brand new baseball and softball field. Finally, five new tennis courts will replace our existing dilapidated courts.

Lastly, as always, I'd like to thank our amazing alumni association for your devotion to our school, your generosity to our students and your ongoing support of our programs and me as I end my fourth year as principal of our great school.

Everyone enjoyed and appreciated getting back to live performances.

We are all hoping that we will be able to do even better in supporting the PRHS students for the 2022-2023 school year. Wishing everyone a very enjoyable summer.

Salute to Principal Greenfield

20 Years of Mr. Greenfield at Port Richmond High School

In June of 2022, seniors were sitting in their second period classrooms listening to Principal Greenfield on the loudspeaker congratulating them for their accomplishments. The Class of 2022 is Mr. Greenfield's fourth graduation class; however, they're the first freshman class he has seen through all four years as their principal. Throughout his 20 year career at PRHS he has established himself as loyal, supportive, out-going, respectful, and the exemplar of a leader. Many people became acquainted with Mr. Greenfield between his years of being a student and becoming principal.

In June of 1988, Andrew Greenfield was a senior in his homeroom at Port Richmond High School

rent staff members knew Mr. Greenfield at the beginning of his teaching career.

Mr. Greenfield from the start of his teaching career when he was a social studies teacher at Fort Hamilton High School. "We started working together as teachers at Fort Hamilton HS on the same day in September, 1993. After a few years, we both worked in the Conflict Resolution office. Mr. Greenfield taught the conflict resolution class and I trained the peer mediators. We had always been friends and carpool buddies, but it was fun sharing an office as well," said Mrs. Woodman. Mr. Greenfield and Mrs. Woodman no longer share an office but they share the same experience of being Assistant Principals of Organization (APO). Mr. Greenfield started his career at PRHS in 2001 as AP of Security, but eventually became APO.

While Mr. Greenfield's role changed over the years, his strong character stayed the same. "Mr. Greenfield shows our students and staff his kindness in so many ways, whether it's giving out a snack or listening to someone who has had a bad day. The entire Raider community benefits from this because he exemplifies what a Total Raider is and hopefully all members of our community strive to do the same," said Mrs. Woodman. Furthermore, he is very thoughtful and considers the needs of his staff and students. When he sees them struggle, he does everything in his power to make sure they are alright and well. "There was a violent rainstorm in 2009 or 2010.... There was flooding along Charles Avenue and I could see the water starting to rise to the door handle of my car. Mr. Greenfield came to my classroom as I was teaching and saw how stressed I was. ... He took my keys and waded through knee deep water to move my car to dry ground. I will never forget that act of kindness," said English teacher, Ms. Donna Ryan.

Mr. Greenfield does not have to perform heroic acts to show his kindness; he also does it by listening, "A particular thing that Mr. Greenfield is good at is making sure that all students are in a good mood for school. He says hi to students when you walk by, is very friendly, and if you need to talk to him he will always be there with open arms," said PRHS senior, Bryan Payne.

Treating one another with respect and kindness are aspects of what Port Richmond High School students and staff call Raider Spirit. Mr. Greenfield's actions exemplify Raider Spirit on a daily basis. "The most memorable experience with Mr. Greenfield probably occurred when I was working as a dean under his supervision as AP Security. We were all a part of a great team and Mr.Greenfield always treated us with the utmost respect. He always expressed his appreciation of our hard work," said AP of Physical Education, Ms. Nancy Cena. "... his greatest gift is that he approaches his job the same way every day - he always puts the students first, he cares about the well-being of his staff, and always has a kind word for everyone he comes across. It has been a privilege to see this daily," said science teacher, coach, and dean, Mr. John Sce.

"Mr. Greenfield has come into my class several times over the years and got involved in many discussions in government classes, much to the delight of the students and myself," said social studies teacher, Mr. Arthur Driscoll. Clearly, Mr. Greenfield follows his own advice. "While I was in the Black Student Cau cus he listened to what we had to say and made sure we felt heard," said senior, Fabiola Rosales. Most students have had great experiences with Mr.Greenfield and they think that he has done a stellar job at being principal, even during these tough times. They could not have asked for a better principal who cares a lot about the students' safety, "He cares much about his students and their safety. He has also done well with all the precautions he makes the students take with

the pandemic and making the senior class of 2022 have a fun senior year," said PRHS Senior, Ashley Soriano.

Mr. Greenfield walks out of this building filled with Raider Pride when he reflects on all the wonderful students that walk into his school each day. Principal Greenfield addressed the seniors at a College Decision Day celebration, "I am proud to be your principal. You are exactly what all Raiders strive to be." He can be seen throughout the school showing students just how proud he is. At the 8th Annual Poetry Slam facilitated by Mrs. Lori Ross and Ms. Tayla Lugo, Mr. Greenfield addressed the poets with encouraging words before their performance. Not only did he compliment them on their creativity and courage, he took the stage to read the love poem he wrote for his wife on their wedding day. Physical education teacher, Ms. Antonietta Spitalieri notices how Mr. Greenfield puts 100% of himself in the work he does for his school, "Throughout the past 20 years at Port Richmond High School, I have watched Mr. Greenfield put his heart and soul into everything he does The love and devotion, plus the tremendous amount of time he pours into PRHS, is so heartwarming. He is a true Raider that goes beyond all measures! We are blessed to have his leadership and dedication in our amazing school."

There are many more examples that illustrate Mr. Greenfield's positive contributions to Port Richmond High School in his 20 years of leadership.
